Paul Flick was born and raised in Martinsburg. He graduated from Martinsburg High School in 1941. While at Martinsburg, he lettered in football, basketball, and track. He attended Brown University, continuing his foot ball career. He left Brown to serve as a medic during World War II. After the war he finished his degree at Shepherd.

Mr. Flick played professional football for the Pittsburgh Steelers. An injury ended his career, and he returned to teach at Martinsburg High and assist the legendary coach, John Cobourn. Mr. Flick was later appointed Assistant Principal. In this position he dispensed discipline and advice to change students' behavior and character.

Upon retiring from education, Mr. Flick completed a doctorate in Ministerial Studies and served as pastor at several churches.
